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#### **CLAUSES**

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#### A Bill for

#### AN ACT of the County Assembly of Marsabit to provide for the imposition or variation of various taxes, fees, charges, licences, rents or rates for services pursuant to Article 209 and 210 of the Constitution and for connected purposes.

ENACTED by the County Assembly of Marsabit as follows -

	PART I – PRELIMINARY
Short title and commencement	1. This Act may be cited as the Marsabit County Finance Act, 2023 and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the Gazette.
Interpretation	2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires -
	<ul> <li>"Authorized channel" means the manner in which a person may effect payment to the County, including but not limited to a person designated by the executive committee member pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, to collect or receive revenue or any other mode of payment as may be prescribed from time to time;</li> <li>"Authorised officer" means any officer of the County Government designated as authorized to collect or administer revenue under this Act or any other written law in accordance with the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;</li> <li>"Cess" means a form of levy charged on domestic agricultural trade imposed under this Act or any other written law and payable to the county government of Marsabit;</li> <li>"County" means the County Government of Marsabit;</li> <li>"County public officer" means a County Public Officer within the meaning of Section 2 of the County Governments Act, 2012;</li> <li>"County Revenue Collector" means the county public officer appointed pursuant to Section 158 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;</li> <li>"County Receiver of Revenue" means the persons appointed pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;</li> </ul>

	"Executive Committee Member" means the executive committeememberforthetimebeingresponsibleformattersrela
	tingtofinancein the county;
	"fees" means payments made to the relevant county department in exchange for services rendered;
	"Licence" means the permits granted by the relevant county department to carry on trade under this Act or any other written law;
	"permit: means an original permit issued under this Act;
	"Person" means a natural or juristic person;
	"Rent" means payments made as provided by section 7 of this Act; and
	"Trade" has the meaning assigned under the Marsabit County Trade Licensing Act, 2017.
	PART II - FEES, CHARGES AND RENT
General Fees and Charges	<b>3.</b> (1) A person who wishes to carry out the activities specified in the First Schedule shall pay the fees specified in the last column of the relevant Part of that Schedule.
	(2) A person who wishes to carry out any of the activities listed under Part I-XI of the First Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County.
	(3) The County shall grant the relevant permit(s) to the applicant(s) upon payment of fees prescribed in the relevant Part of that Schedule and may be required to meet such other requirements as may be set out in any other relevant written laws.
	(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.
Firefighting and other related services	<b>4.</b> (1) A person who intends to hire the County Government facilities or to obtain from the County Government services specified in Part II of the First Schedule shall pay the fee prescribed in the last column of relevant part of that Schedule.
	(2) A person who is carrying out or intends to carry out a business within the County shall pay an annual fire safety inspection fee prescribed in the last column of the relevant part of Part II of the First Schedule.

	(3) A person shall pay the fee prescribed in the last column of the relevant part of Part II of the First Schedule for routine inspection which may be carried out from time to time by an authorized officer to ensure compliance with fire safety measures.
	(4) A person who requests for training by the County Government for fire safety shall pay the fee prescribed in the relevant part of Part II of the First Schedule.
	(5) A person who fails to pay the fee prescribed in subsection (2) or having received a service or hired an equipment or vehicle fails to pay the fee prescribed under this section contravenes the provisions of this section shall be liable to pay to the County Government a penalty of ten per cent of the fee chargeable.
	(6) In addition to any other remedy under this Act, a person who contravenes the provisions of this commits an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine of a sum not exceeding Kenya Shillings fifty thousand or an imprisonment term not exceeding three months or to both.
Registration of Education Institutions	<b>5.</b> (1) A person who intends to establish and operate an Early Childhood Development and Education centres specified under Part III of the First Schedule shall first apply for a permit and pay to the County Government the fee prescribed in the last column of that Part.
	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), a person applying for a permit under this Act may be required to meet such other requirements as may be set out in any other relevant written laws.
Impounding and Demurrage charges	6. (1) An authorized officer may impound an animal or goods of any person for purposes of enforcing this Act or any other written law, including laws relating to environment, transport, livestock management and regulation of any trade.
	(2) An animal or goods impounded by the County Government shall be released upon payment of the fee specified in Part IV of the First Schedule.
	(3) Where an animal or goods impounded by the County Government is not claimed by the owner for a period of not less than six months, such animal or goods shall be disposed in accordance with the provisions of the Public Procurement and Disposal Act, 2015 and the proceeds shall be realized by the County Government.
Public works	7. (1) A person who intends to acquire the use of a way leave charges or to obtain the county government services specified in Part V or Part VII of the First Schedule shall apply for the necessary approvals where applicable

	and pay the County Government the fees prescribed in the last column of relevant part of that Schedule.
	(2) Any monies generated under Part V (Quantity Survey services) of the First schedule shall be paid into the County Revenue Fund or such other accounts opened for such purposes.
	(5) The Funds under this section shall be managed in accordance with the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.
County Parks, Reserves and Other Charges	<b>8.</b> (1) A person who intends to access the tourist's sites and sanctuaries specified in Part VI of the First Schedule shall pay the day fee prescribed in the last column of that Part.
	(2) A person who is found within the tourist sites and sanctuaries specified in subsection (1) and has no proof of payment of the prescribed fee shall pay a penalty equivalent to half of the relevant prescribed fee.
Fisheries	9. (1) A person who intends to carry out any of the activities specified
Licenses	under Part VIII of the First Schedule shall first apply for a permit and pay
LICENSES	to the County Government the fee prescribed in the last column of that
	Part.
	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), a person applying for
	a permit under this Act may be required to meet such other requirements as may be set out in any other relevant written laws.
<b>Co-operative</b>	10.(1) A person who intends to carry out any of the activities specified
services	under Part IX of the First Schedule shall first apply for a permit and pay to
	the County Government the fee prescribed in the last column of that Part.
	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), a person applying for
	a permit under this Act may be required to meet such other requirements
	as may be set out in any other relevant written laws.
Trade Licence	11. (1) A person shall not carry out any trade or provide the services
Fees	specified in the Second Schedule without a valid trade license or permit
	issued by the county.
	(2) A person who intends to carry out any of the trade listed in the Second
	Schedule shall apply for a licence or permit from the sub- county office
	where the business is located or from a designated agent as may be
	prescribed by the County from time to time.
	(3) A person who applies for a licence under subsection (2) shall be issued with a licence upon payment of the fee specified in Second Schedule.

	<ul> <li>(4) A licence or permit issued under subsection (3) shall be visibly displayed at the business premise at all times, failure to display will attract a fine of Kenya shillings one thousand.</li> <li>(5) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Section commits an offence and is liable to a fine of Kenya shillings five thousand.</li> </ul>
Liquor Licensing	<b>12.</b> (1) A person who intends to carry out any of the activities specified under Part III of the Second Schedule shall first apply for a permit and pay to the County Government the fee prescribed in the last column of that Part.
	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), a person applying for a permit under this Act may be required to meet such other requirements as may be set out in any other relevant written laws.
Solid Waste, Environmental Management and other related environmental charges	<ul> <li>13. (1) A person who wishes to receive or carry out the services specified in the Third Schedule shall pay the solid waste management service fee prescribed in the relevant Part of that Schedule.</li> <li>(2) A person shall not offer any of the services specified in the Third Schedule unless that person has first obtained authority or permit of the relevant County Department.</li> <li>(3) A person intending to receive a service from the County Government</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>or offer a service specified in Part I of the Third Schedule shall pay the fee prescribed in the last column of the relevant section of that Part.</li> <li>(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the County Government shall only grant the relevant authority or permit to an applicant under this section upon the applicant meeting the requirements relevant to waste management prescribed under any other relevant written laws.</li> <li>(5) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.</li> </ul>
Noise Pollution permit	14. (1) An occupier or owner of any premises whether movable or immovable shall not permit noise pollution unless that person has first obtained a permit from the County Government.
	(2) The County Government shall only issue the permit to the applicant upon payment of the fees prescribed in Part II of the Third Schedule and meeting the requirements set out under any other relevant written law.

	(3) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an
	offence.
County Parking Areas and penalties	<b>15.</b> (1) A person who uses County parking shall be charged a fee specified in Part I of the Fourth Schedule.
	(2) There shall be penalties for late payment of parking fees, impounding of vehicles as specified in part II of the Fourth Schedule.
The county bus park or picking and dropping bays	<b>16.</b> (1) A person who uses a County bus park or picking and dropping bays shall be charged the fee specified in the relevant section in Part I of the Fourth Schedule.
Days	(2) A public service vehicle's SACCO or a public service vehicle registered group may apply to the County Government for reservation of a particular area, picking or dropping bay and pay the fees prescribed in Part I of the Fourth Schedule.
	(3) For avoidance of doubt, the reservation under subsection (2) shall not be construed to be a charge in lieu to the provisions of subsections (1) or any other relevant provisions of this Act.
	(4) An authorized officer may impound a vehicle or an item of any person who fails to pay the fee prescribed under this section.
	(5) For purposes of this section, a County Government parking attendant or any other enforcement officer of the County Government is an authorized officer.
	(6) A person who fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence under this Act and in addition to any other penalties as may prescribed under this Act or any other relevant written law, shall be liable to pay the penalties specified in the relevant section of Part II of the Fourth Schedule.
	(7) Upon payment of a parking fee, a temporary parking permit shall be issued and shall be in a conspicuous place on the surface of the vehicle for ease of inspection by an authorized officer.
	(8) A person who contravenes any of provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall, in addition to any other remedy under any other written law, pay the penalties and fees prescribed under Part II of the Fourth Schedule.

Registration of public service vehicles and booking offices	<ul><li>17. (1) A person who intends to operate a public service vehicle shall register the vehicle and pay the fee prescribed in the relevant section of Part I of the Fourth Schedule</li><li>(2) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.</li></ul>
Lands, Housing and Physical Planning fees	<ul> <li>18. (1) The County shall offer the services specified in the Fifth Schedule upon receipt of payment of the fee prescribed in the last column of that Schedule.</li> <li>(2) A person who wishes to construct a building or structure in the manner specified in the Fifth Schedule shall apply for a construction permit in accordance with the relevant laws on physical planning to the County Department responsible for physical planning.</li> </ul>
	(3) Any person who carries out development within the County without the appropriate plan approval shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable for a conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand or an imprisonment term not exceeding one year or both.
Rental housing property management	<b>19.</b> (1) A person occupying a Land or Plot, stall or a building or any premises of the county government as a leased or rented premise shall pay rent to the county government, at the rate specified in the last column of Part VI of the Fifth Schedule.
	<ul> <li>(2) The rent referred to under subsection (1) shall be due in case of—</li> <li>(a) a plot, on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January in each year,</li> <li>(b) a house, building, or a stall, or such other premises by the 05<sup>th</sup> day of every month.</li> <li>(3) A penalty of ten percent per month or a part thereof shall be charged on the outstanding rent on any of the County Government premises.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>(4) A person who contravenes the provisions of subsections 2(a) or 2(b) may be evicted if he fails to pay the rent for three consecutive months.</li> <li>(4) A penalty of three percent compounded per month shall be charged on the outstanding rent on a plot that remains unpaid after 31st day of March.</li> <li>(5) The County may repossess any property referred to under subsection (1) above if the person fails to pay the rent for more than one year.</li> </ul>

Advertisement and signage	<ul><li>20. (1) A person who wishes to display advertisements or signage in the manner specified in the Fifth Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County department responsible for physical planning.</li><li>(2) The Department responsible for physical planning may grant the</li></ul>
	necessary permit referred to under subsection (1) upon payment of the fees prescribed in the Fifth Schedule and meeting any other requirements set out under any other relevant written laws.
	(3) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.
Market Fees	<b>21.</b> (1) There shall be a fee for access of markets or stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products as specified in Part 1 of the Sixth Schedule.
	(2) A person who wishes to access the markets or the stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products shall pay the fees specified in the last column of Part 1 of the Sixth Schedule.
	(3) A penalty of fifty percent per month or a part thereof shall be charged on the outstanding rent on any of the County Government premises.
	(4) An authorized officer may evict from the market or stall any person who contravenes the provisions of this section.
	(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.
Hire of county Vehicle and	<b>22.</b> (1) A person shall not use the County Government machinery or equipment without the authority of the County Government.
machinery	(2) A person who wishes to use a county government machinery or equipment shall apply to the relevant county government department.
	(3) The relevant county government department may, on application in accordance with subsection (2) grant the authority upon payment of the required charges specified in the last column of Part I of the Seventh Schedule.
	(4) A person who contravenes the provision of this section commits an offence and, in addition to any other remedy under any other written law, the person shall be required to pay to the County Government the cost of hire of the equipment and a daily penalty for every day that the person is

Livestock and Veterinary services fees	<b>26.</b> (1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in Part II or III of the Eighth Schedule without authority from the County Government Department.
Public Health Services Fees	<ul> <li>25. (1) A person who carries out business or provide services shall acquire requisite clearance from County public health offices in their respective sub counties after payment of the fee specified in the last column of part IV of the Eighth Schedule.</li> <li>(2) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>(3) The relevant county government department may grant the permit or provide the services specified in the Schedule upon payment of the fees specified in the last column of that schedule and only if the applicant meets the requirements of any other relevant written laws.</li> <li>(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.</li> </ul>
Food and Drugs permit and public health services	<ul><li>24. (1) A person shall not sell the products, operate the business or receive the services specified in Part I of the Eighth Schedule without a permit from the county government.</li><li>(2) A person who wishes to sell the foods or drugs or receive the County services specified in the Eighth schedule shall apply for a permit from the relevant county government department.</li></ul>
County stadium, Grounds or Halls or baraza parks	<ul> <li>in possession of the machinery or equipment at the rate prescribed in Part I of the Seventh Schedule.</li> <li>23. (1) A person shall not use the County Stadia, grounds or hall or baraza parks specified in Part II of the Seventh Schedule without authority from the county government.</li> <li>(2) A person who wishes to use the County Stadia, ground or hall or baraza parks specified in Sub Section (1) above shall apply for a permit to the relevant county government department.</li> <li>(3) The relevant county government department may grant the permit referred to in subsection (2) upon payment of fees prescribed in the last column of the relevant part of that Schedule.</li> <li>(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.</li> </ul>
	in possession of the machinery or equipment at the rate prescribed in Part

	(2) A person who wishes to carry out any of the business or provide the services specified in Part II or III of the Eighth schedule shall apply for a permit to the relevant County Government Department.
	(3) The relevant County Government Department may grant the permit under subsection (2) upon payment of fees prescribed in that schedule and upon meeting the requirements of any other written law.
	(4) Trading of livestock shall only be conducted at the livestock markets.
	(5) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.
Infrastructure maintenance fee	<b>27.</b> (1) A person who operates a quarry or transports quarry products from, into or through the County shall pay a fee specified in Part I of the Ninth Schedule for the maintenance of infrastructure.
	<ul> <li>(2) A person transporting agricultural products from, into or through the County shall be charged a fee specified in Part II of the Ninth Schedule for the maintenance of infrastructures.</li> <li>(3) A person who contravenes provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and conviction shall, in addition to any other remedy under any other relevant written laws, pay to the County Government a penalty equivalent to twice the prescribed fee.</li> </ul>
	(4) Notwithstanding the generality of sub-section (3), an authorized officer may impound a vehicle of any person who is contravening the provisions of this section.
	(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.
Tax waivers, variations	<b>28.</b> The executive committee member may exempt, waive or vary fees or charges payable under this Act in accordance to the criteria prescribed in the regulations.
Amendments to the schedules	<b>29.</b> (1) The executive committee member may by order published in the gazette amend any of the Schedules.
	(2) Any order made under subsection (1) shall be laid before the County Assembly without unreasonable delay, and unless a resolution approving the order is passed by the County Assembly within the next twenty-one days on which it next sits after the order is so laid, the order shall lapse, but without prejudice to anything previously done there under.

	PART III - PAYMENT
Payments to the County	<b>30.</b> (1) All payments to the County shall be paid through an authorized channel.
	(2) A County Revenue Collector or enforcement officer enforcing this Act shall have an identification card issued by the County.
	(3) The identification card issued under subsection (2) shall be worn visibly by the officer when carrying out any of the functions under this Act.
	(4) A county official receipt shall be issued for all payments made to the County
	(5) A person shall not receive or collect any money on behalf of the county unless he has been authorized to do so.
	(6) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.
Appointment	<b>31.</b> (1) In this section—
and duties of an agent	"Agent" means a person appointed as such under subsection (2)
	"a notice" means a notice issued by the executive committee member appointing an agent;
	(2) The executive committee member may by written notice addressed to any person—
	(a) appoint him or her to be an agent of the County for the purposes of collection or recovery of charges, permit fees, licence fees, rent, cess and such other fees, as may be necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Act;
	(3) An agent appointed under this section shall enforce, ensure due compliance with the provisions of this Act and remit all revenue collected to the county receiver of revenue or as may be otherwise instructed in the appointment notice.
	(4) Where an agent claims to be, or to have become unable to comply with subsection (2), he/she shall, within seven working days, notify the executive committee member in writing, setting out fully the reasons for his inability to comply, and the executive committee member shall accept the notification and cancel or amend the appointment notice accordingly.

	(5) Where an agent fails to pay an amount of money collected under this section, the provisions of this Act relating to the collection and recovery of revenue shall apply to the collection and recovery of that amount as if it were revenue due and payable by the agent, the due date for the payment of which was the date upon which that amount should have been paid to the County Government under this subsection.
	(6) An agent who makes a payment to the County Government under this section shall for all purposes be deemed to have acted under the authority of the County Government and shall be indemnified in respect of that payment against all proceedings, civil or criminal, and all processes, judicial or extrajudicial, notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary in any written law, contract or agreement.
	PART IV - OFFENCES AND PENALTIES
General Penalty	<b>32.</b> (1) A person who commits an offence under this Act for which no penalty is provided shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or both.
	(2) A person who hinders, obstructs, interferes or prevent an authorised officer or any other person duly authorised in writing by the executive committee member in exercising the powers under this Act shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or to an imprisonment term not exceeding six months or both.
	(3) A person who refuses to give information or gives false information which may lead to under charging in addition to any other remedy under this Act shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or to an imprisonment term not exceeding six months or both.
Offences by staff of the County	<b>33.</b> A member of staff of the County or any other person having a duty to perform under this Act who;
	(a) makes in any record, or document required to be kept or made by that person, an entry which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe not to be true or to be false;
	(b) Wilfully refuses to do anything which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to know is required to be done;
	(c) interferes with any other person or process under this Act, so as to defeat the provisions, requirements or purposes of this Act;

	(c) where required under this Act to do anything to give effect to the provisions of this Act, fails to do such thing;
	(d) without reasonable cause omits to do something in breach of his or her duty under this Act;
	(e) wilfully contravenes the provisions of this Act to give undue advantage or favour to another person; or
	(f) fails to prevent or report to the County Government or any other relevant authority, the commission of an offence committed under this Act;
	Commits an offence and is liable on conviction, to a fine not exceeding fifty thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.
	PART V – MISCELLANEOUS
Savings	<b>34.</b> (1) Any charges, permit fees, licence fees, rent, infrastructure maintenance fee and such other fees payable to the County at the
	commencement of this Act but which are not included in any of the
	Schedules to this Act, shall continue to apply under the existing by-laws
	of the defunct local authority until such by-laws are specifically repealed or replaced by county legislation.
	(2) All directions, resolutions, orders and authorizations on, or relating to financial management, including the collection and administration of
	fees and charges given or issued by the previous county councils, before
	the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been given, issued
	or made by or under the authority of the County Assembly until the expiry or repeal of those directions, resolutions, orders and authorizations, and
	shall continue, with the necessary modifications, to apply, be paid and
	administered under this Act:
	Provided that this sub-section shall also apply to such fees and charges
	levied by various ministries and departments of the National Government
	in respect of functions devolved to the county under Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution which fees and charges shall be levied by the
	County on performance of the devolved functions.
	(3) All references to Councils shall include all Local Authorities as were
	defined under the now repealed Local Government Act, Cap 265 of the
	Laws of Kenya.

Cessation	<b>35.</b> Unless otherwise provided in this Act, the rates for fees, charge licences, cess or rent applicable to the goods, services or activities listed the Schedules before the commencement on this Act shall cease to apply	
Regulations	<b>36.</b> The executive committee member may make regulations for the better carrying out of the purposes and provisions of this Act

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Bill is prepared pursuant to Article 209 and the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution, section 132 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 dealing with revenue raising measures for County Governments and Standing Order No. 218of the county assembly which requires county finance bill to be presented to the assembly as a legislative proposal.

The Bill seeks to provide for the various taxes, fees and other service charges that are payable to County Government of Marsabit. These are set out in the Schedules. The said Schedules also sets out the rates payable to the County Government for enhanced service delivery and to enable the County Government perform the increased functions bestowed on it by the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution.

#### Statement on delegated powers to legislate

The Executive Committee Member responsible for Finance is empowered to bring into operation the various provisions of the Act or certain sections of the Schedules. This is to enable the putting in place of the necessary physical, administrative and personnel infrastructure that would aid in the operationalization of the collection of the proposed taxes, fees and charges.

The operationalization of certain provisions of the proposed law shall entail an expenditure of public funds. The funds will be provided for in the estimates.
