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#### 1: INTRODUCTION

The Drought Resilience Programme in Northern Kenya (DRPNK) is a 6-year programme implemented in Marsabit and Turkana counties and partly funded by German Development Bank (KfW) The objective of the project is to strengthen the resilience of pastoral and agro-pastoral livelihoods in the target areas through investment in infrastructure.

The programme is jointly funded by the Government of Kenya, the County Governments of Turkana and Marsabit and the Federal Republic of Germany through German Development Bank (KfW).

As one of the Project Executing Agencies (PEA), The County Government of Marsabit plans to construct a range of infrastructure as set out in the first Annual Investment Plan (AIP-1).

- 1. The County Government of Marsabit now invites eligible consulting firms ("Consultants") to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The shortlisting criteria on required qualifications and experience of the firm are:
  - i. Experience in the assignment, including technical and managerial capability of the firm;
  - ii. Number of years in business working on the area of the assignment;
  - iii. Reference to at least three assignments of similar nature and size carried out in the last 5 years. Include persons or institutions and contact addresses (phone, email) who can be contacted on the same.
- 2. The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to the following provisions that will be highlighted in the Request for Proposals to be issued to shortlisted firms.
  - i. The Consultant will be expected to have no conflict of interest with other assignments or its own corporate interests and acting without any consideration for future work;
  - ii. The consultant has no personal or business relationship with the Procuring Entity's senior management or professional staff;
  - iii. A firm or an individual in the firm has not been sanctioned by the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) or are under a suspension or a debarment imposed by any other entity of the Government of Kenya, or any international organization;
- iv. Government-owned enterprises or institutions of Kenya Government, officials and civil servants and employees of public institutions are not eligible.
- 3. Consultants **<u>shall not</u>** associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications, in the form of a joint venture and/or a sub-consultancy.

Selection of the consultant will be based on Quality and Cost Based Selection method using the Tender Procedure National Competitive Bidding as provided for in the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act 2015 (PP&DA). The evaluation committee shall be appointed by the accounting officer according to section 46(1) of PP&DA 2015.

challenged and dispute resolution is still pending or has not confirmed a full settlement against us;

2.6) being subject to an exclusion decision of the World Bank or any other multilateral development bank and being listed on the website http://www.worldbank.org/debarr or respectively on the relevant list of any other multilateral development bank (*in the event of such exclusion, the Applicant or Bidder shall attach to this Declaration of Undertaking supporting information showing that this exclusion is not relevant in the context of this Contract and that adequate compliance measures have been taken in reaction)*; or

2.7) being guilty of misrepresentation in supplying the information required as a condition of participation in the Tender.

3. We hereby certify that neither we, nor any of the members of our Joint Venture or any of our Subcontractors under the Contract are in any of the following situations of conflict of interest:

3.1) being an Affiliate controlled by the PEA or a shareholder controlling the PEA, unless the stemming conflict of interest has been brought to the attention of KfW and resolved to its satisfaction;

Moreover, we shall implement environmental and social risks mitigation measures when specified in the relevant environmental and social management plans or other similar documents provided by the PEA and, in any case, implement measures to prevent sexual exploitation and abuse and gender based violence.

financing by the European Union also to European institutions having competence under European Union law, to inspect the respective accounts, records and documents, to permit on the spot checks and to ensure access to sites and the respective project.

In the case of being awarded a Contract, we, as well as all our Joint Venture partners and Subcontractors under the Contract undertake to preserve above mentioned records and documents in accordance with Applicable Law, but in any case for at least six years from the date of fulfilment or termination of the Contract.
